MESSAGE FROM REV. DR. TIM

July 25, 2025

Dear First Congregational Friends,

I'm writing today with a full and grateful heart to share some wonderful news:

Last night, the Way Collective community unanimously passed the consent motion to move forward in formal partnership with First Congregational Church Santa Barbara.

The approved motion reads:

"To begin a formal process of partnership with First Congregational Church Santa Barbara — co-developing shared structures and commitments, clarifying roles and mission alignment, and working to co-create a sustainable and shared spiritual home through the end of 2025 and beyond."

This is a significant and hopeful moment — the fruit of many seasons of conversation, discernment, and patient waiting. On behalf of the entire Way Co community, I want to express my deep gratitude to all of you: for your openness to Spirit, your hospitality, and your generosity in allowing this discernment process the time it needed to unfold for us.

It has been my privilege to serve as your bridge minister over the past 7 months — to get to know and walk with you, to listen deeply, and to witness the heart and faithfulness of this congregation. I'm truly looking forward to continuing to serve you in a more permanent pastoral role as this new chapter unfolds.

Your willingness to imagine a shared future together has made it possible for this vision to begin taking shape. Thank you for walking gently and faithfully through this time with us. We'll need that same kind of openness and flexibility in the months and years to come, as we dream a new dream, together.

So...what's ahead, you might be wondering?

Now that both communities have affirmed the intent to pursue this

partnership, we'll spend the remainder of 2025 working together to clarify and co-develop the key structures that will support our shared life: legal and financial frameworks, shared governance, staffing roles, and a new committee with a common mission rooted in our respective identities and histories.

Our shared aim is to move toward a fully unified community by January 1, 2026 — a new beginning for both of our communities as we step into something co-created and Spirit-led.

There will be many steps to come — and much to build together — but today I simply want to pause and say: thank you! Thank you for your faith, your imagination, and your patient trust in this unfolding process. I am so excited that, together, we will get to continue the long legacy of UCC and DoC ministry here in Santa Barbara!

It continues to be my deep joy to serve among you as your bridge minister, and I'm filled with excitement about what we will co-create in the months ahead. May this new chapter deepen our sense of belonging, strengthen our shared mission, and make more space for contemplative love and justice to grow in the heart of Santa Barbara.

JULY TRANSITION HOUSE MEAL

The shelter-worker portion of July's FCCSB FoodTeam met at Transition House's shelter on West Ortega St. on Tues. July 8th. Peter and Suzanne Brown, Peter Ford, Bud and Sharon Kayser, Lynn Stewart and I divvied up the work. We made next-day lunches, set tables, placed chairs around the tables, sliced fruit and generally prepped for the evening meal, all by ~6:15 pm = dinner time.

After stopping for a quick prayer of thanksgiving for the opportunity to be there together, Lynn left us. Peter B., Bud, Sharon and Suzanne served slices of warmed French bread (the Browns), oven-BBQ'd chicken pieces,*quinoa w/vegs. & rice (Sharon), refried beans,* hot veggies (Lynn) or and/or green salad (Lynn) along with watermelon pieces. Butter* was out on each of the tables; sliced, pickled jalapenos* and salsa* were on a side table near the serving counter for people to help themselves.

Peter F. put cookies* out on plates which I passed, once dinner was well underway. He also refilled any serving pans when needed and took charge of wrapping and labeling dinner plates to be set aside for the late comers. Just when we thought we were finished, a new family of five arrived. We were pleased to able to feed them.

(We were prepared to feed 55 residents: 32 adults and 23 children between 2 and 12, but upon arriving found that a couple of families had left TH earlier that day. The numbers were down to ~ 45 and Kristin, the Shelter Manager, filling in for Sal, declined a meal.)

When the servers had finished, including providing seconds for those who wished them, the servers

filled plates and sat down to eat. Peter and I picked up the leftover food and departed to have our dinner at home and clean-up there.

A very big 'Thank You!' to all June FCCSB Foodteam Members. Whether you gave financially, furnished food, purchased supplies or worked at the shelter, your assistance was truly appreciated. This Outreach cannot be done by one person. It is truly a Congregational endeavor.
