THOUGHTS ABOUT MEMBERSHIP

One topic that has come up multiple times during Mission Board meetings is the concept of "membership" in a church. For some people, membership is not important: they come on Sundays because they like to hear the preacher, or the music, but feel no need for a long-term commitment. And in fact, what does it even mean to become a "member" of a church? You can attend everyservice, worship freely, take communion, and even get baptized without officially joining a church. So what does membership get you?

Membership with a particular church community means entering into a relationship with it. A member asserts: I am a part of you and you are a part of me. We join our hands together to help build a world according to a common vision. In the UCC, membership includes "covenant," a word vital to the UCC since its formation. Here's one definition of covenant, by Wolfgang Roth and Rosemary Radford Ruether: A covenant is a communion between partners, solemnly initiated, binding the partners into a new pattern of life and letting them mutually define each other.

At FCC, becoming a member involves just a few simple elements: a desire to walk with other members in faithfulness and love, a public statement (usually during a Sunday service), and a commitment to support the work of the congregation in whatever ways the member is able.

Membership bestows one right to an individual, a right that is especially important during this time when FCC is making decisions about its future: the right to vote.

If you have any desire to take the step into official membership, please contact Martha or Tim. We encourage anyone who has interest in the work and direction of FCC to join into covenantwith us.





AUGUST TRANSITION HOUSE MEAL

FCCSB's Transition House FoodTeam prepared a nutritious meal and made next-day lunches for the residents of Transition House's shelter on Tues. Aug. 11th. Although there were 28 adults & teens along with 23 children in residence, we saw only about two-thirds of the older group along with the children in the dining room.

First to the shelter was Lynn Stewart, who arrived early, ~ 4:30 pm, to cook some veggies and make a salad. Bud Kayser and granddaughter Haley Cook, just back from her year abroad in Greece, were unloading their car when Peter Ford and I arrived about 5:20 pm. By the time I got into the kitchen, Haley was already working w/ Lynn and Bud and Peter F. were setting up lunches. Chris, our Evening Volunteer, had the tables set, etc. Peter Brown joined us a little after 5:30 and Anne Shaw stopped by to drop off a rice dish. All preparations were underway and we found ourselves ready to serve well before the residents were called down for dinner at 6:15.

After our quick prayer of thanksgiving, Peter B.,Bud, Haley and Lynn served slices of warmed French bread (the Browns), oven-BBQ'd chicken pieces,* ricew/ tomatoes & turmeric (Anne), black beans w/ corn and salsa,* hot veggies (Lynn) and/or green salad (Lynn) along with orange slices,* and watermelon (found on the premises) pieces. Butter* was out on each of the tables; sliced, pickled jalapenos, grated cheese* and salsa* were on a side

table near the serving counter for people to help themselves.

Once dinner was well underway, I passed pieces of Nancy Chase's choc. chip cake—always a dessert favorite! The servers gave out seconds for those that wished to have them, filled 10 plates for late comers and then, minus Peter B., who left us, sat down for their own meal. Peter and I picked up the leftover food and departed to have our dinner at home and complete the clean-up there.

A very big 'Thank You!' to all June FCCSB Foodteam Members. Whether you gave financially, furnished food, purchased supplies or worked at the shelter, your assistance was truly appreciated. Every month it is very obvious: This Outreach cannot be done by one or two persons. It takes a dedicatedCongregation!
